


OPENCOESIONE: New interface lunched in July 2023






OPENCOESIONE: started from observation








Data utility for collaboration



Data help in expressing better evaluation questions

i.e Research sector: a NUVAP pre-evaluation analysis based on data on over 21,000 projects selected considering procedural information in order to extract a sample as a basis for an in-depth evaluation

At the School of OpenCohesion in Europe

In Italy the project was launched in 2013. In other European involved countries (Bulgaria, Croatia, Greece, Spain, Portugal) the pilot initiative started with the 2019-2020 school year

From the first pilot in Italy (2013) the project reached overall more than **34,000 students** and **3,000 teachers** with **1.400 monitored projects** freely selected


